The Helen Storrow Seminar gives young women like **RACHEL** the chance to develop as leaders and return home and make a meaningful difference to the environment. In 2019, Our Chalet hosted 36 participants from 28 different countries to become environmental changemakers.

Pop-up Helen Storrow Seminars take place during the same week as the event at Our Chalet and deliver an adapted programme at national level. In 2019, 8 locations hosted Helen Storrow pop-up seminars, between half a day and 6 days, for over 350 girls and women in total.

"Accessibility to a WAGGGS international experience is fantastic for our girls because we're so far from anywhere else so travel is much more expensive and difficult. We love the concept of pop-ups or linking to others and want to really explore this further. If our pop-up had been longer, we feel we might have indicated different important advantages using this model. In 2019, we launched a brand new and ambitious delivery model for the Juliette Low Seminar, creating a space for over 700 volunteers and participants to lead, learn and connect together.

Made possible by the participating Member Organisations and supported by the Olave Baden-Powell Society (OB-PS), participants took part in one of 18 different global hub locations. Each location offered the one-week programme in up to two of the WAGGGS languages: Arabic, English, French or Spanish.

In the next 12 months, we will see up to 500 girl-powered projects take flight as a direct result of the Juliette Low Seminar, ranging from programmes to end gender-based violence, to projects targeting climate action, girls' nutrition and inclusion and



I will organise a conference style event with sessions on resume building, salary negotiation, leadership, entrepreneurship, practical skills (landscaping, computer programming...), etc. Girls will learn about the pay gap that begins with youth and ways to fight it. They will be encouraged to explore different options for summer work. At the end of the workshop employers will be invited to a summer job networking fair with the girls.

CROSS-CULTURAL EXPERIENCE

The Youth Exchange South to South (YESS) Girls Movement is our international exchange programme, funded by the Norwegian Agency For Exchange Cooperation (NOREC), a Norwegian Government Agency.

YESS gives women like LUCIA the skills and confidence to take up governance positions at local, regional and even international level.

This year, 45 young women took part in their YESS International Exchange experience, giving them a platform to become agents of change in their host countries, home countries and in the global community.





"I had the best experience. I got to learn how the girls felt about [their periods], hearing and actually sharing their stories; hearing about how myths and taboos have affected the girls was the saddest and quite emotional part. GIRL-LED PROGRAMMES

We launched our first Menstrual Hygiene Education Guide 'Rosie's World' in collaboration with WASH United. The MHM Education Guide takes girls like **GEORGINA** on a journey to teach them about menstruation and how to manage it safely, hygienically and with confidence.

Girls as Drivers of Change, funded by Postcode Global Trust and in a partnership with Save the Children UK, runs in Uganda and Jordan until the end of 2020. Our ambition: to end gender-based violence through awareness raising, community action and developing the leadership skills of girls and young women like **JOAN**.

INCREASE VISIBILITY

The Young Women's Advocacy Forum (YWAF) is an annual event held before the Women Deliver Conference to give young women like IZABEL practical advocacy and communication skills to help them plan a project in their own country. This year, YWAF was organised by our global programmes Action on Body Confidence and Girl Powered Nutrition and in partnership with Dove and Nutrition International.


These global partnerships also facilitated access for WAGGS delegates to speak at Women Deliver events as experts on girls and young women alongside high-level government and UN representatives, CEOs, social entrepreneurs as well as other youth delegates.


WAGGGS ADVOCACY CHAMPIONS 2019



SPEAK OUT FOR HER WORLD

Early this year, we announced a brand new network of Advocacy Champions. This group of young women represent Girl Guides and Girl Scouts worldwide to advocate for the rights of girls and young women and champion gender equality at a local, national and international level.

In March 2019, WAGGGS Advocacy Champions participated in the 63rd UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), representing the voices 10 million girls across the world.



2019 saw us bring together 500 people across all five regions for the WAGGGS Regional Conferences. On the programme, a celebration of world Guiding and Scouting and a chance to discuss the future of the Movement, with valuable feedback for WAGGGS. Members appointed five brand new Regional Committees, paving the way for more young women to take decision-making roles at Board level.



BUILDING LEADERSHIP CAPACITY

Working in collaboration with seven Member Organisations, and volunteers like **J0EY**, this year we built a set of ten outcomes of the WAGGGS leadership model. The outcomes describe the leadership that we believe girls will develop by practising the model; and we will use them to evaluate the quality and impact of the global leadership programme, local leadership training and approaches.

"The model gives you a clear picture on how to provide the best at any particular time or situation. This has made it easier for me to connect internationally. It has made me realise how a small action or decision can affect the group. Now, before I react, I take time to understand my intention and apply all the mindsets."

This year, we trained 38 volunteers from the Africa Region, in French and English, to become WAGGGS facilitators. Young women like **ACKISSAH** will become ambassadors for WAGGGS' core mission, implementing the new leadership offer in the Africa Region and beyond. These young women have already facilitated at the Africa Region Conference, Juliette Low Seminars and introduced the model to over 700 girls at a National Camp.



A STRONG AND VIBRANT MOVEMENT

CAPACITY BUILDING

Our Capacity Assessment Tool (CAT) helps associations, and WAGGGS, to understand and evaluate their organisational capacity via a self-assessment process. We are using the results to identify individual needs and areas of development, and finding recognised areas of best practice. With over 70 Member Organisations taking the non-compulsory assessment up until the end of 2019, we've already gathered significant insights.
